9:45 am Tour of St. Louis Cemetery #1

1:15 pm Meet Carla Boullion, Tour Guide, at the Historic Buckner Mansion to begin your tour of the Magnificent Garden District

It is 1853... 'Cotton is King,' New Orleans is the center of the universe, and you are Henry Sullivan Buckner. You commission renowned architect Lewis E. Reynolds to build the most beautiful and magnificent mansion in the very heart of New Orleans' Garden District. The result is one of the finest examples of Southern ante-bellum architecture, having a scale of elegance from the 19th Century that is rarely found. The Buckner Mansion is indeed the envy of the Garden District - a 'landmark amongst landmarks.' This 20,000+ square foot residence is so stately with its 48 monumental Ionic and Corinthian fluted cypress columns and, yet, so charming with endless Verandas, ornate cast-iron, and 'floor to ceiling' windows.

Today the landmark mansion has become a common destination spot for filming – its most iconic 'starring role' was as *Miss Robichaux's Academy for Exceptional Young Ladies* on the third season of *American Horror Story*.

Tour of the Garden District will end at The Rink across from Lafayette Cemetery #1

3:00 pm Lafayette Cemetery #1 Tour with Carla Boullion

Located in the heart of the Garden District, Lafayette Cemetery No. 1 is the oldest of the seven municipal, city-operated cemeteries in New Orleans.

At the conclusion of the tour, the remainder of the day is yours to enjoy

DAY 3 TUESDAY - OCTOBER 4

The morning is yours to enjoy! Perhaps cafe' au lait, beignets and the opportunity to people watch at Café du Monde before wandering The French Market, Jackson Square or visiting the New Orleans Pharmacy Museum – whatever suits your fancy!

1:00 pm Meet at the Spanish Plaza to board the Creole Queen for an Historical River Cruise

Focusing on the critical Battle of New Orleans, this cruise is narrated by a costumed re-enactor who takes guests on a journey through the history of the city as we sail downriver to the Jean Lafitte National Historical Park and the historic Chalmette Battlefield. Highlights of the tour include the founding of the city by the LeMoyne brothers, the expansion of the city into the “French Quarters” of the Tremé and Marigny, the Louisiana Purchase, and the Battle of New Orleans. A one-hour shore excursion at the battlefield features a guided tour and talk by National Park Rangers. Return to the Spanish Plaza at 4:30 pm.

DAY 4 WEDNESDAY - OCTOBER 5

8:00 am Hotel Pick up (be ready and in the Courtyard by 7:45 am!)

Relax on a morning narrated journey through scenic cypress swamps with a professional historian. Hear of a land of Creoles, pirates, slaves and voodoo and view 7 plantations, including Evergreen, Whitney, Felicité Columbia and St Joseph, as you travel the Old River Road to visit Laura, a Creole plantation whose charm is as rich as her history.

Meander further along the Old River Road to arrive at the treasure of the Old South, the magnificent antebellum **Oak Alley** mansion. With 28 three-century-old oak trees lining its entrance, Oak Alley is an exquisite reminder of a bygone era, an era now "Gone with the Wind".

The tour centers on plantation history, antiques and architecture. After the tour, relax on the historic grounds, sip a Mint Julep, take pictures, enjoy the snack shop or visit their large Gift Shop.

Enjoy a delicious New Orleans style lunch at a great Cajun restaurant (included).

After lunch, take a two-hour tour of the hauntingly strange historic Manchac Swamp on a bayou boat ride.

5:00 pm Arrive back at your hotel - hopefully in one piece.

8:00 pm Farewell Dinner at Muriel's in Jackson Square (Casual Fine Dining)

During dinner at Muriel's, you'll be enveloped by the rich history of the *Vieux Carre* while the spirits of yesteryear dine alongside of you.
