Why Are Some Ancient Locations Active While Others Aren't?

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was struck several times by the same experience on my recent trip overseas. I've written about all the layers of entities I have seen in some ancient locations. I expected that. But what I found particularly interesting were all the ancient locations I visited where I didn't pick up anything at all.

I spent time in some incredible places that I would have thought would have been full of activity, or at least beings to read, and I found them flat with no paranormal energy. This happened in a variety of places. I analyzed the locations to see what, if anything, they had in common. Besides centuries or even millennia of constant human habitation, they were all very active with the living at the time. Some were tourist sites; others just lots of daily activity.

The photos shown in this article are ones I took in a location I thought would have been particularly active. They are of the ruins of a 14th century palace where Vlad the Impaler enlarged and lived in part of the time. I didn't get to go into the museum, unfortunately, and I might have felt or seen much more there, but where I was standing, nothing — no paranormal energy at all.

Can Present Energy Erase Past Energy?

I was wondering if all the activity of the living in the locations could sort of erase the energy left by the past, and affectively wipe out any "ghostly" presence. I could imagine that the energy from the living might, over time, neutralize that of the paranormal, sort of like a positive and a negative canceling each other out. But that really doesn't make sense to me as most of the places I visited with similar histories and current activity levels with human interaction did have paranormal records and beings.

The locations themselves might be the cause. There are theories that stone, especially certain types of stone,

flowing water, and other things store or magnify paranormal energies. But I found that the geographical and architectural constructs were the same in areas with strong paranormal energy and areas with none. So that can't account for my experiences.

Do Entities Hide From the Living?

Another possibility is that the entities in the location are just so used to the living and might even be rather

annoyed by us that they just don't reveal themselves. They just want to go about their business without being bothered by us. We, the living, do this sometimes. We shut down and shut out everyone else — sort of burying our heads in the sand. It makes sense to me that paranormal entities can do the same.

It is also possible that the energy is there, and I was just distracted or having an off day and didn't notice anything. That certainly happens. No psychic is perfect and always on.

And I was surrounded by so much history and beauty, as well as interesting and enjoyable people, that I might not have been able to pick up on the paranormal in those locations, even when I purposely opened up to see who might be there.

Drawn to the "Present" Experience

The theory that makes the most sense to me is that a combination of the last two scenarios are most likely the cause of the lack of paranormal energy and activity I experienced in some places.

The entities had no desire to be noticed, and I was awestruck by the amazing world around me, so I was drawn more to the present experience of the past instead of the beings of the past.◆
